SUBJECT: Increased Cost of Compliance and Advisory Base Flood Elevations

Last year, FEMA provided details about the development of advisory base flood elevations (ABFEs) to better apply Increased Cost of Compliance (ICC) benefits (W-05081, 11/18/05). Specifically, if a community adopts and enforces FEMA-provided ABFEs, then ICC benefits will be available in those communities to elevate buildings to the new ABFEs instead of the BFEs provided on the existing Flood Insurance Rate Maps.

The attached documents list the communities in Mississippi and Louisiana, by County or Parish, that have adopted ABFEs or freeboard requirements or a combination of both. The documents include Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance Summaries for both the Mississippi Gulf Coast and Louisiana Parishes, along with the locations/addresses for the affected community Floodplain Management Maps (FIRMs).

We believe that the Summaries are largely self explanatory. You will note that some of the adoptions will not go into effect until some time in the near future. If rebuilding is done before that time, then the existing BFEs are in effect, which means that there are no BFEs to enforce in B, C, X, or D zones.

Following are some highlights concerning the notations in the Summaries:

ABFEs outside the SFHA have been adopted

Adjuster will need to consult the ABFE maps at the locations mentioned above. ABFEs outside the SFHA indicate that there are new requirements in formerly B, C, X, or D zones.

 Still negotiating with city officials, no vote yet, to be decided The ABFE has not yet been adopted; therefore the existing FIRM +1 foot of freeboard, is still in effect.

 Also adopted +14 feet elevation in a designated Community Hazard Area (D'Irberville box) ICC will not be available in that area.

Please note that if a claim has been denied because the ABFEs were not yet in effect, the claim must be reviewed in light of the newly adopted elevations.

As new actions are taken by the communities, we will continue to notify you.
